CITIZEN CHARTER

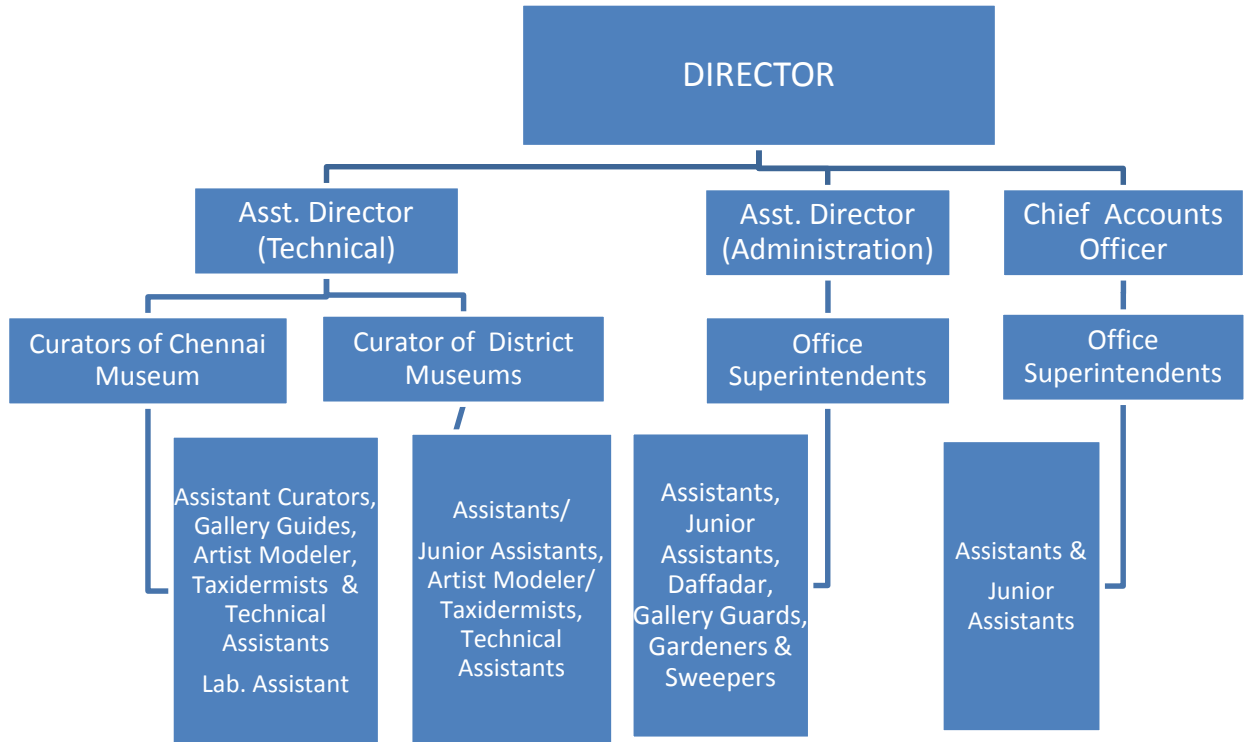
Tamil Nadu is located in the tip of peninsular India. It has an unbroken History commencing from Paleolithic period and was later ruled by various dynasties. Monarchs of the Tamil country built many high raised granite structures in different architectural modes and carved metal images with artistic styles in different time frames. Art, Architecture, Literature were cherished. Tamil is the only language in the whole world which got a royal patronage for many centuries. Tamil Nadu became an epicenter for all art forms. Geography of Tamil country is inherited with rich species of flora and fauna. Hence, the second largest and oldest Museum emerged in the erstwhile Madras Presidency in the year 1851 C.E. Government Museum, Chennai is a rich repository of artefacts of Archaeological importance, objects of Geology as well as Wet and dry specimens of natural science of the Indian subcontinent remembering poet Bharathi's version "*Sendriduveer Ettuthikkum kalaichelvangal yavum Konart hingu serpeer*" (Go all the eight directions¹ and bring valued artefacts)

Prior to the implementation of the Indian Treasure Trove Act, 1878 - Museum artefacts were collected through the field collection, gift, purchase and exchange with other museums. In 1880's gigantic whale skeleton and skeleton of an elephant were

brought to the museum which was the major attraction of that time. "Indian Treasure Trove Act 1878" expedited heavy inflow of art objects such as bronze images, stone sculptures and coins came to this museum. Excavated artefacts of Adhichanallur and Arikamedu gave a new dimension to the Museum in the field of Anthropology. After the Independence Bronze Gallery, Gallery of Contemporary Art and Children's Museum were newly constructed and dedicated to the public.

History and culture are always relayed on inscriptions, copper plates and coins as their main source. Prime duty of a Museum is to preserve such source materials for posterity. First evident specimens of animals and extinct animals were preserved in the Museum. Museum laboratories extends the life span of artefacts and also restores them for the future generation. Museum is a silent class room wherein education takes place in a noiseless manner. If school children couldn't reach the Museum, then Museum will reach their schools in remote Villages through Museo' bus. In the recent years the Government Museum Chennai provides better service through modern facilities such as animated models, LED illumination, attractive signages and informative labelling.
