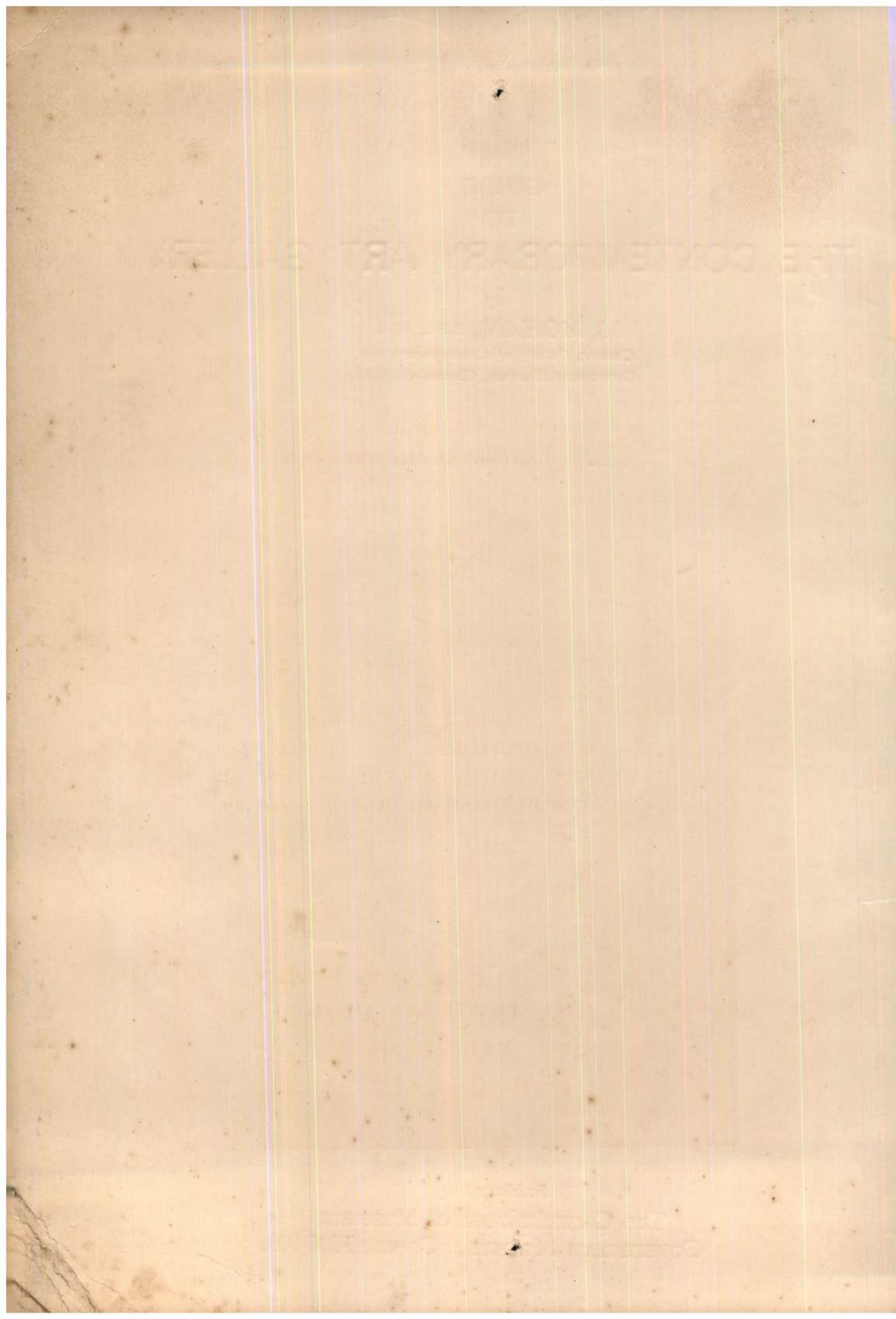

FOREWORD

The National Art Gallery has become one of the oldest monumental building constructed in memory of Queen Victoria in the year 1909. From its inception to 1941, the Victoria Technical Institute used it as its Head Quarters. In the year 1945, the Madras Government formed a departmental Committee to develop art Industry and artisans from South India. The Government considered that it was necessary to establish a separate picture gallery illustrating various phases of Indian Painting namely Traditional and Modern. Since the formation of National Art Gallery in 1951, it became an integral part of Archaeology section till 1982. At that time about 54 paintings were displayed in the National Art Gallery.

Since the collection of Modern paintings increased there was a great awakening among the art lovers. Hence, necessity arose for having a separate building exclusively for Modern paintings. It was fulfilled in the year 1984 and new Art gallery for modern painting named as Contemporary Art Gallery was born. About 110 Modern paintings and 10 Modern sculptures are now displayed in the Contemporary Art Gallery.

Presently the Madras Museum has a good collection of about 1,200 paintings in the Art Section. The medium of those paintings consists of 250 Oils, 220 Tempera, 200 Water colour and others. The Madras Museum has recently purchased in 1995 about sixty art objects from Fifty nine artists from Tamil Nadu which were finished during 92 - 93 and are they are now to be displayed in the Art exhibition.

This Guide prepared by Thiru. M. Mohan, Curator, Gallery of Contemporary Art acquaints the art lovers with the details about the selected works of art exhibited in the gallery and the artists - Paintings and Sculptures - who produced them.

It is a very useful publication.

PREFACE

It is interesting to note that simultaneous with its acquisition of great works of ancient South Indian art, the Government Museum, Chennai had been collecting works of modern Indian art right from the present century. When the National Art Gallery was set up in 1951, these works of modern Indian art were placed in it.

A Guide to the National Art Gallery prepared by Dr. V.N. Srinivasa Desikan, Curator in-charge of the Art Gallery was brought out in 1967. As this Museum continued to acquire works of art and as there was not enough space for them in the National Art Gallery, an annexure to the National Art Gallery building was proposed by Dr. S.T. Satyamurti, Director of Museums from 1961-1978. When this proposal approved for the year 1981-82, the building was constructed in 1983. The then Director of Museums Thiru N. Harinarayana felt that the new building could house all works of modern Indian art which were in the Museum collection and that it could be called Gallery of Contemporary Art. The gallery was accordingly organised by him and inaugurated on 25th January 1984.

This Gallery now displays with modern paintings and modern Sculptures. The works range from those of Raja Ravi Varma the harbinger of modern art in India to those of young artists namely Nandagopal, Dakshinamoorthy and others. I have enumerated the works of art generally in order of their display in the gallery and provided brief notes about the artists who produced them.

I express my deep sense of gratitude to Thiru K. Dheenadhayalan, I.A.S., Commissioner of Museums, Government Museum, Chennai for his encouragement in the preparation and publication of this Guide.

I also thank Thiru N. Harinarayana, the then Director of Museums, Chennai, for having gone through the manuscript and made comprehensive revision of this book.

This Guide book has been printed in the D. T. P. Section, Government Museum, Chennai. I express my thanks to Dr. N. Devasahayam, Deputy Director of Museums, Government Museum, Chennai, Dr. Rama Narayanan, Asst. Professor, Fine Arts, Stella Maris College, Chennai, Thiru S. Shyama Rao, Tamil Nadu Ovia Nunkalai Kuzhu, Chennai, Thiru D. Jawahar Prasad Raj, Curator, Geology Section and Dr. V. GUIDE TO THE CONTEMPORARY ART GALLERY CHENNAI

----- INTRODUCTION

The Contemporary Indian art refers to the contemporaries of eminent artists and their counterparts in their respective field lived at the same time.

The traditional Indian Painting basically representing religious in nature. It has flourished inspite of domination of mughal painting. During the mughal rule, the traditional painting restored its position in Lucknow, Patna, Mysore, Tanjore and Maharashtra. But the British conquest of India brought a different concept of the Visual arts. Sometimes the Britishers made criticism on Indian Painting. The Britishers introduced Oil painting in India. By the early 19th century they decided to teach their pattern of style in Western technique to the native youth of India. Simultaneously they started an art school first at Madras in 1850 and it followed by similar art schools in Calcutta, Bombay and Lahore in 1854, 1857 and 1875 respectively.

In an inaugural address delivered by the then Governor of Madras Lord Napier in 1871, suggested that the "Unrivalled opportunities for artistic description" provided by Indian mythology and in particular, contained the most inexhaustible and diversified stores of pictorial representation which any country possesses.

As if in having cue for his suggestion, Raja Ravi Varma, the pioneer of modern Indian art painted the scenes from Hindu mythology and popularised it. He introduced large bright areas of colour in his portrait and landscape. He dominated the art scene like a colossus from 1870 to till his death in 1906.

In 1895, Abanindranath Tagore (1871 - 1951) emerged and later founded the Revivalists School of Painting in Bengal with the encouragement of E. B. Havell. He is also introduced a new technique with Indian ideals of art. His disciples namely D.P. Roychowdhury, Nandalal Bose, Asit Kumar Haldar and others followed the principles and spread his style all over the country. Another Indian eminent artist emerged before independence was Amrita Sher-Gil. She has innovated a new style of painting pertaining to folk scenes. In North, Asit Kumar Haldar a great artist from Bengal performed a vital role in the development and made notable contributions to modern art. He painted in tempera, and water colour medium. He became the principal of the College of Arts and Crafts in Santiniketan, Jaipur and Lucknow from 1911, 1924 and 1925 respectively.



A renowned artist from Bengal D. P. Roychowdhury came to South to be the principal of the College of Arts and Crafts, Madras from 1929 to 1957. He has executed many important commissions in India, a notable among them is "Triumph of Labour", Martyr's memorial Patna, the Statue of Mahatma Gandhi at Marina in Madras. He has also written books in novels. His paintings and Sculptures depicts and reflects scenes of emotional patriotic feelings and rural impact of people. He did hundreds of busts and statues and mastered in composing human figures.

In the history of Indian art Jamini Roy (1887 - 1972) stands out as the moving treasure house of the traditional painting. During early part of his life he was acclaimed all over the country as a portrait painter. Suddenly around 1920, he abandoned western technique and turned to the peasant painters of Bengal.

Madras came into more prominence era in respect of contemporary Indian art movement in post independence. The Madras School of Arts and Crafts had produced many outstanding artists namely P.L. Narasimhamurti, S. Dhanapal, L. Munuswamy, K. Sreenivasalu and whose great works were of high reputation. After independence there was a sudden spurt in quality and quantity of Contemporary art. The Gallery of Contemporary art of the Government Museum, Madras had shown extraordinary prescience, in starting a collection of Indian Contemporary art right from the beginning of this century. While at first the paintings were acquired at random, later the Acquisition Committee was set up on 1945 and thus they continued a systematic collection of works of modern art. Even now the Acquisition Committee meets once in a year and acquire art objects from those offered to it. They were exhibited later in the National Art Gallery.

While the artists grew in number the audience for art also increased. It was felt a separate gallery exclusively for the modern painting was necessary. The new building established in the year 1984 for this purpose, called the Gallery of Contemporary art and modern paintings and sculptures are displayed in an orderly and systematic manner. This gallery of Contemporary Art traces the growth of contemporary art in India from the time of Ravi Varma down to the present. The modern paintings and sculptures of well known artists namely Raja Ravi Varma, Devi Prasad, Roychowdhury, Nandalal Bose, Jamini Roy, Dhanapal, Sreenivasalu, Jaya Appasway, Reddappa Naidu and others are now displayed in the Contemporary Art Gallery. This Guide gives a glimpse into the reasonably representative collection of modern Indian art exhibited in the Gallery.



FORMATION OF THE GALLERY

In the year 1945, a Departmental Committee was formed by the Government to develop and encourage the art industry and artisans of South India. The Committee considered that it is apt to start a separate painting gallery illustrating the various phases of Indian Painting namely traditional and modern. At the time of the Centenary Celebrations of the Government Museum, Madras in 1951, a new gallery called the National Art Gallery was set up and it was opened by the then Prime Minister of India Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru to commemorate the occasion.

In the course of time, it was found that the building of the National Art Gallery didn't have sufficient space to accommodate all the art objects thus acquired necessitating the storage of such newly acquired objects. The National Art Gallery Committee at the meeting on 21.3.1965 suggested that a proposal may be sent to Tamil Nadu Government for the construction of a new building in which the objects regularly acquired could be displayed. Accordingly the Director of Museums, Dr. S. T. Satyamurti, (1961-1978) sent a proposal for a new building called the National Art Gallery annexure at a cost of Rs. 16.50 Lakhs. This proposal was however deferred for some other times in the first instance. The proposal for the new building was renewed by the successive Director of Museums regularly. The proposal was approved by the Government in the year 1981-82. The construction of the building commenced on 8th August 1981 during the period of Thiru N. Harinarayana, the then Director of Museums. The contemporary Art Gallery was organised by him and was declared open to the public on January 25th 1984.

The beginnings of contemporary art as evidenced by artists like Raja Ravi Varma V.M. Dhurandhar etc. are depicted through their paintings. The works of such eminent artists namely D.P. Roychowdhury, Jamini Roy, Nandalal Bose, etc. who were pioneers in the field in their times are also displayed in the Gallery. All these works down to the most recently acquired ones would be on show in the new gallery.

The Chennai Museum in total has a good collection of about one thousand two hundred works of contemporary Indian artists in the Art Section. Paintings of different artists in India from various schools of art are represented in the collection. The break up of details of the medium are as follows: Oils 250, Tempera 220, Water colour 200, Graphics and others. A selection of modern paintings and modern sculptures from various schools are now exhibited in the contemporary Art Gallery. Besides this some more are kept in the reserve collection. The Madras Museum has recently purchased about Fifty nine art objects in the year 1995 whose works are done during the year 1992-93. Out of these purchase, the works of familiar artists are namely P.L. Narasimhamurti, P.B. Surendranath, R. Varadarajan, S. Kannappa and others. The Madras Museum evinced keen interest to acquire works of art through Art Purchase Committee for Government Museum and National Art Gallery.

RAJA RAVI VARMA : (1848 - 1906)

A native of Kilimanoor, a town forty kilometres to the north of Trivandrum, Kerala State, Raja Ravi Varma was born in 1848 and was one of the pioneer of modern Indian art. He was influenced by western technique but he chose for his subject themes from Hindu mythology. He has participated in many art exhibitions held in India and abroad and had won many Gold medals. He died on 2nd October 1906.

Raja varma was the younger brother of Raja Ravi Varma and was born in 1860 in Travancore. He worked in oil medium and his style is half-western. He is the first Indian landscape artist. He joined with Ravi varma as companion and collaborator during their many productive years. He died on January, 4th 1905.

RAJA RAMA VARMA (1880 - 1967) :

Rama varma was the son of Ravi varma and was born in 1880 in Travancore. He was the follower of his father's style. The theme of his work are portraits and puranic stories. He worked mainly in oils. Rama varma accompanied his father to paint a portrait of the Maharani of Udaipur in March 1901. Rama varma died at the age of 87 in 1967.

JAMINI ROY (1887 - 1979) :

Jamini Roy was one of the eminent modern Indian artists and was born in 1887 in a middle class family in Bankura district, west Bengal. He studied art in the Government School of Arts, Calcutta in 1903.

Jamini Roy was a portrait painter and used to paint with ordinary native pigments like Vermillion, robin blue, white chalk, ad plain earth. He himself prepared his art brushed with cotton or jute tied around sticks. The Tagore School of art attracted him and he started painting the scenes from rural Bengal. Later he specialised in indigeneous folk style applying tempera and poster colour. He worked in oil, water colour and tempera. He died on 24th April, 1979.

V.M. DHURANDHAR (1867 - 1944) :

M.V. Dhurandhar was a native of Bombay and was born on 18th March 1867. He studied art from 1890 to 1895 in the Sri. J.J. School of Art, Bombay. His art works are influenced by the Western technique. He was a young contemporary of Raja Ravi Varma. His specialised themes are studies from life and epic stories.

He has participated in art exhibitions held in India and had won Silver medal and Bronze medals. He died on 1st June 1944.

NANDALAL BOSE (1882 - 1966)

A native of Bihar, Nandalal Bose was born in 1882 and he had his art education

under the guidance of Abanindranath Tagore in the College of Arts and Crafts, Calcutta in 1905. He was one of the eminent artists of Bengal.

He made sketches and copies from reproduction of paintings including those of Raphael, (Italian Artist) and Raja Ravi Varma and continued the basic of drawing and painting from his cousin Atul Mitra. He worked in tempera a medium more in keeping with his robust temperament. He assisted Lady Herringham in making replica of Ajanta and Ellora paintings in 1910 - 11.

He has written many articles on paintings. The Universities of Banaras Hindu and Calcutta conferred on him the Degree of D.Lit. He died on 16th April, 1966.
